Careers Education/PSHE

Careers and Ambition is the focus of PSHE lessons. We teach a spiral curriculum, with each year group returning to the Careers theme but with an age-appropriate focus eg.

- Year 7 Self-review and learning from failure
- Year 8 Labour Market Information
- Year 9 Employability Skills
- Year 10 Work Experience prep and study skills
- Year 11 Post 16 Options & Revision skills

Character Education

We teach our students to STRIVE for success. This half term our work will focus on developing 'Empathy'; encouraging respect for others.

Students are encouraged to do the right thing, without being asked. They should be 'ready' to learn with smart uniform, the correct equipment and attitude and be prepared to challenge themselves to achieve their best. Next half term our focus is 'Self-discipline'.



Extra-curricular programme





We have a wealth of extra-curricular activities on offer to students. This includes, art, drama, music and sport. This year we have also external agencies to come into school to lead sporting activities. Students participate in 'Hansel and Gretel' an opportunity for our talented students to perform in front of the school community at the end of January

Academic support is also provided for Y11 students with period 6 revision sessions in core subjects in preparation for mocks.
















Student Leadership

We have elected a range of student leaders in different capacities as we value their contribution to the school community. Our **Y11 prefect team** has designed their programme of activities for the academic year. They are running several fundraising events for Prom and are exemplary role models for our school community. We have a fully functional **school council** who help us to work on school improvement. Recently we have appointed students in Y8 and Y9 to work as **student receptionists**, a valuable work experience opportunity for them.





House Events

All staff and students belong to a house; Boulton, Cadbury, Tolkien or Austin. This provides them a community to belong to. Students are encouraged to earn their positive points each day and to participate in a range of house activities to be in with a chance of winning the house cup at the end of the academic year. So far students have competed in a Black History Month poetry and art competition, to raise funds at the Christmas Fayre and for the Christmas Card competition. Positive points are earned through demonstrating our STRIVE character traits, by going over and above for the school community and crucially for excellent attendance and punctually.

Educational Visits

Visits are arranged to give students memorable experiences, to engage them in the curriculum they are learning and to develop cultural awareness. Trips arranged in the Spring term include a visit to the Spanish Onatti theatre and for Y8 the immersive Spanish restaurant experience and some Y7 students will visit Birmingham hospital to deliver their findings from the NHS research project. Tutor time programme

Fundamental British Values & SMSC

It is our responsibility to teach our students British Values and Social, Moral, Spiritual and Cultural (SMSC) education so that our students understand expected behaviour from British citizens, preparing them for their life in modern British society. Some examples include:

- Students experienced the democratic process by electing school council leaders and form captains
- Black History Month is used as a vehicle to promote diversity and encourage respect and tolerance
- Students are taught the difference between what is right and wrong and are encouraged to be 'Ready, Respectful and Safe' but they also learn through sport where they develop skills of fair play and sportsmanship
